HOW TO SET A HARLEY DAVIDSON SCREEN SAVER ON DIFFERENT DEVICES

Once you’ve downloaded your perfect image, setting it as your screensaver is straightforward. Here’s a quick guide for the most common platforms.

Windows 10/11

- Right-click on your desktop and select “Personalize.”
- In the Background dropdown, choose “Picture” or “Slideshow.”
- If using a single image, click “Browse” and select your downloaded Harley Davidson wallpaper. For a slideshow, pick a folder containing multiple screen savers.
- Adjust the “Choose a fit” option (Fill, Fit, Stretch, Tile, Center, or Span) to your preference. “Fill” or “Fit” usually work best for widescreen monitors.
- Close the settings—your new screensaver will appear automatically.

macOS

1. Open “System Settings” (or “System Preferences” on older versions).
2. Click “Wallpaper” (or “Desktop & Screen Saver”).
3. Drag and drop your Harley Davidson image into the folder section, or click “Add Folder” to create a slideshow collection.
4. Select the image or folder, and choose how it fills the screen (e.g., “Fill Screen,” “Fit to Screen”).
5. Optionally, set the “Screen Saver” tab to use the same image or a different one for when your Mac is idle.

Android

1. Open your device’s Gallery or Photos app.
2. Navigate to the Harley Davidson screen saver you saved.
3. Tap the three-dot menu (or “Set as wallpaper” option).
4. Choose “Home screen,” “Lock screen,” or “Both.”
5. Adjust the crop if needed, then confirm.

Alternatively, you can long-press an empty space on your home screen, select “Styles & wallpapers” (or “Wallpapers”), and pick the image from your library.

iOS

1. Open the Photos app and find your Harley Davidson image.
2. Tap the Share button (square with arrow).

3. Scroll down and select “Use as Wallpaper.”
4. Pinch to adjust the zoom and position if necessary.
5. Tap “Set” and choose “Set Lock Screen,” “Set Home Screen,” or “Set Both.”

CREATING YOUR OWN HARLEY DAVIDSON SCREEN SAVER

If you own a Harley and have a good camera, you might want to create a truly personal screensaver. Nothing beats seeing your own bike on display every time you wake your device.

Tips for Taking Great Bike Photos

- **Lighting:** Golden hour (just after sunrise or before sunset) gives warm, flattering light that makes chrome and paint pop.
- **Background:** Choose a location that complements the bike—an empty road, a scenic overlook, or a brick wall for an urban vibe.
- **Angle:** Low-angle shots (shooting from ground level) make the bike look powerful and imposing. Side profiles or three-quarter views usually work best.
- **Details:** Close-ups of the engine, handlebars, or emblem can be striking as wallpapers.
- **Cleanliness:** A clean, polished bike photographs much better. Take a few minutes to wipe down dust and fingerprints.

Using Software to Create Slideshow Screen Savers

If you have a collection of photos, you can create a slideshow screensaver that cycles through them. On Windows, simply create a folder with your images, go to Personalize > Lock screen > Screen saver settings, select “Photos,” and point it to that folder. On macOS, use the “Screen Saver” tab in System Settings and choose the folder. For advanced control, free tools like IrfanView (Windows) or built-in photo apps can create timed slideshows with transitions. This way, every few minutes you see a different Harley Davidson screen saver, keeping your digital space fresh and exciting.
