Blocking from the Messages App on Android

3. Select **"Details"** or **"People & options"**.
4. Tap **"Block & report spam"** or simply **"Block contact"**.
5. Confirm your action.

Just like on iPhone, blocked callers on Android will go straight to voicemail, and you will not receive their messages.

- 1. Open the chat with the contact.
- 2. Tap the contact's name at the top.
- 3. Toggle the "**Block**" option.

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
