INITIAL SETUP: STEP-BY-STEP FROM THE MANUAL

1. Insert Batteries (or Plug

In)

Many models come with an AC adapter and also have a battery backup compartment. The manual recommends inserting two AA batteries (not included) for backup. If you use only the adapter, note that the time and alarm settings will be lost if power is interrupted. Place batteries in the compartment following the polarity markings (+/-). The clock will begin flashing “12:00” to indicate it needs to be set.

2. Set the Time

Press and hold the **TIME SET** button (sometimes labeled “SET”). While holding it, press the **HOURL** button

repeatedly to advance the hours. Press the **MINUTE** button to advance minutes. Many manuals advise releasing the SET button after you see the correct time. For models with AM/PM indicators, ensure the little PM dot is lit or unlit as appropriate.

3. Set the Alarm

Press and hold the **ALARM SET** button. The display will momentarily show the alarm time (often flashing). Use the same HOUR and MINUTE buttons to change the alarm time. Release the ALARM SET button. The alarm icon (usually a small bell) will appear on the screen, indicating the alarm is armed.

4. Activate the Alarm

Most Timex Indiglo models have a separate alarm on/off switch or a button that toggles the alarm. The manual states that a simple slide switch or a press of a dedicated button will enable the alarm. When active, the bell icon remains on the display. To deactivate the alarm, move the switch to OFF or press the button again.

5. Test the

Indiglo Night Light

Press the large top button (“SNOOZE/LIGHT”) once. The entire display should glow green or blue, depending on the model, for about 5 seconds. If your clock has a separate night light slider, push it to the “ON” position. The manual explains that the night light is a steady glow, not the brief Indiglo pulse. It may be brighter on one side—this is normal.

USING THE ALARM AND SNOOZE FUNCTIONS

Once you have set the alarm, it is important to understand the behavior

described in the **Timex Indiglo night light alarm clock manual**.

How the Alarm Sounds

The Timex Indiglo alarm produces a classic beep. The beeping starts softly and increases in volume over a few seconds (a feature called “progressive alarm”). The manual may indicate that the alarm will sound for a set duration—typically up to 90 minutes unless you turn it off. The snooze function gives you an extra 9 minutes (or sometimes 5 minutes, depending on the model) of sleep before the alarm reactivates.

Using the Snooze Alarm Volume Button

When the alarm sounds, simply press the large top button. The alarm will stop and reset to go off again after the snooze interval. The manual warns that the alarm will automatically stop after its maximum duration if ignored, but the snooze can be used repeatedly. To permanently turn off the alarm for the day, press the alarm off switch or slide the alarm switch to OFF.

Some models have a small slider or dial for volume control. Check the manual's diagram—it is often on the side or bottom of the clock. Turn it toward "HI" for louder or "LO" for a softer beep.

MASTERING THE INDIGLO NIGHT LIGHT

The Indiglo technology is more than a simple night light. The manual explains two distinct functions that you can use separately or together.

Adjusting the Brief Indiglo

Display Light

This is activated by pressing the SNOOZE/LIGHT button. The entire display illuminates for about 3-5 seconds, allowing you to check the time in the dark without waking up fully. This is perfect for nighttime glances.

Continuous Night Light

Your clock may have a slider labeled “NIGHT LIGHT” with positions OFF, ON, or AUTO. In AUTO mode, the night light may come on automatically in low ambient light (if the clock has a light sensor). In ON mode, the night light

stays on continuously, providing a gentle glow that can help you navigate the room. The manual recommends using batteries if you run the continuous night light while unplugged, as it drains power faster.

Important note from the manual: The continuous night light is separate from the Indiglo backlight. If you find the nighttime glow too bright, cover part of the light with a piece of tape or dim it using the slider.

MAINTENANCE AND CARE TIPS

- **Cleaning:** Use a soft, slightly

TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON

Do not use harsh cleaning agents or spray liquids directly on the clock. The manual advises unplugging the clock before cleaning.

- **Battery replacement:** The low battery indicator may appear as a faint or dim display. Replace backup batteries once a year. The manual emphasizes removing old batteries if the clock will not be used for a long time to prevent leakage.
- **Placement:** Avoid humid areas like bathrooms. Keep away from direct sunlight and heat sources. The night light function works best in a dark room.

PROBLEMS

The Display Is Blank or Dim

- Check if the AC adapter is properly plugged into the wall and the clock.
- If using batteries, ensure they are fresh and inserted correctly.

display flashes but then goes blank, the mainboard may be faulty (consult the manual's warranty section).

The Alarm Does Not Sound

- Confirm the alarm is set (bell icon visible).
- Check that the alarm on/off switch is in the "ON" position.
- Volume slider might be set to minimum. Move it toward "HI."
- Replace backup batteries—some models require batteries for the alarm circuit to function even when plugged in.

The Time Loses Accuracy

- Batteries may be weak. Replace them.
- If the clock is plugged in but the time drifts, the internal quartz movement may need resetting. Consult the manual for a factory reset procedure (often involves removing the batteries and unplugging for 30 seconds).

WHERE TO FIND THE OFFICIAL

Backlight Does Not Light

- Press the snooze/light button firmly. If it still does not illuminate, the battery backup might be dead—even on AC power, the backlight may draw from the batteries. Replace them.
 - If the continuous night light works but the Indiglo pulse does not, the electroluminescent panel may have failed. Contact Timex support via the manual's contact information.
