The primary broadcast affiliates include ABC (KSAT 12), CBS (KENS 5), NBC (WOAI 4), Fox (KABB 29), and The CW (KMYS 35). Additionally, you'll find PBS station KLRN, independent stations, and Spanish-language outlets like Univision (KWEX 41) and Telemundo (KVDA 15).

Knowing which channels carry your favorite shows is the first step to mastering your **Tv Guide San Antonio Texas** experience. Let's break down the key players.

Local Broadcast Channels: The Backbone of San Antonio TV

KSAT 12 (ABC)

KSAT 12 is the ABC affiliate for San Antonio and is known for its news coverage, especially its morning and

evening programs. It airs popular ABC shows like Grey's Anatomy, The Bachelor, and Good Morning America. For sports fans, KSAT carries Monday Night Football and the NBA Finals. You can access KSAT over-the-air (channel 12.1) or through most cable and satellite packages.

- **Key primetime shows:** Dancing with the Stars, Abbott Elementary, 9-1-1
- **Local news:** KSAT 12 News at 5, 6, and 10 PM
- **Digital subchannels:** KSAT 12.2 (weather), 12.3 (MeTV), 12.4 (Movies!)

KENS 5 (CBS)

KENS 5 is the CBS affiliate and a trusted

source for local reporting. It carries the full CBS lineup, including hits like NCIS, Survivor, and The Late Show with Stephen Colbert. KENS also broadcasts NFL games on Sunday afternoons and the NCAA March Madness tournament. If you are looking for reliable news and sports, KENS 5 is a must-have in any **Tv Guide San Antonio Texas**.

- **Key primetime shows:** The Equalizer, FBI, Young Sheldon
- **Local news:** KENS 5 News at 5, 6, and 10 PM
- **Digital subchannels:** KENS 5.2 (The CW), 5.3 (Laff), 5.4 (Catchy Comedy)

WOAI 4 (NBC)

WOAI 4 is San Antonio's NBC affiliate. It

delivers popular NBC programming such as The Voice, Chicago Fire, and Law & Order: SVU. The station also airs Sunday Night Football and the Olympics. WOAI's news team has won multiple awards for investigative journalism. For a balanced mix of entertainment and news, include WOAI in your viewing schedule.

- **Key primetime shows:** One Chicago block, This Is Us, The Blacklist
- **Local news:** News 4 San Antonio at 5, 6, and 10 PM
- **Digital subchannels:** WOAI 4.2 (Antenna TV), 4.3 (Court TV), 4.4 (Defy TV)

KABB 29 (Fox)

KABB 29 is the Fox affiliate, known for its

strong sports lineup including NFL on Fox (NFC games), MLB, and college football. It also carries Fox's animated block (The Simpsons, Family Guy) and hit dramas like 9-1-1: Lone Star. KABB produces its own local morning show, Daytime at 9, and news at 9 PM. Fox is essential for sports lovers and comedy fans alike.

- **Key primetime shows:** The Masked Singer, Hell's Kitchen, The Resident
- **Local news:** Fox News at 9 PM
- **Digital subchannels:** KABB 29.2 (Comet), 29.3 (Charge!), 29.4 (TBD)

KMYS 35 (The CW)

KMYS 35 is the CW affiliate for San Antonio. It airs CW originals like All

American, Superman & Lois, and Riverdale. The CW also carries sports from the ACC and LIV Golf. Programming tends to be more youth-oriented, but it also includes classic sitcoms in the afternoon. Check your **Tv Guide San Antonio Texas** for the latest schedule.

KLRN 9 (PBS)

KLRN 9 is the PBS station serving San Antonio. It offers educational programming, nature documentaries, news analysis (PBS NewsHour), and children's shows (Sesame Street, Arthur). KLRN also has local productions like Texas Week and Arts in Context. It's a valuable resource for families and lifelong learners.

Spanish-Language and Specialty Channels

San Antonio has a large Hispanic population, so Spanish-language TV is prominent. Univision affiliate KWEX 41 and Telemundo affiliate KVDA 15 provide telenovelas, soccer (especially Liga MX), and news. These channels often have their own subchannels as well. If you are looking for international news or entertainment, include these in your TV guide.

Additionally, you can find independent stations like KENS 5.2 (The CW), which we already mentioned, and others like KTFB 4.2 (Antenna TV) offering retro programming.

Cable and Satellite Options for San Antonio

When you sign up for cable or satellite service in San Antonio, you typically get access to all local broadcast channels plus a wide range of national networks. The major providers are Spectrum, AT&T U-verse, and DIRECTV. Here is a quick breakdown:

- **Spectrum:** Offers a large selection of channels, including local HD. Their TV packages range from Spectrum TV Select to Spectrum TV Silver and Gold, with hundreds of channels. Spectrum also provides a DVR service and a robust On Demand library.
- **AT&T U-verse:** Known for its reliable fiber-optic service, U-verse offers over 300 channels in some packages. It includes locals, sports networks like ESPN and Fox Sports Southwest (now part of Bally Sports), and premium channels like HBO.
- **DIRECTV:** A satellite option that works well for rural areas around San Antonio. DIRECTV offers packages with up to 340 channels,

including NFL Sunday Ticket (now available via YouTube TV) and regional sports.

For an up-to-date **Tv Guide San Antonio Texas** with specific channel numbers, check each provider's online listings. Channel lineups can vary by package.

Streaming Services: The Modern TV Guide

Many San Antonio residents are cutting the cord and turning to streaming services like Hulu + Live TV, YouTube TV, Sling TV, and FuboTV. These services

offer live local channels (depending on your area) and national networks. For example, Hulu + Live TV includes ABC, CBS, Fox, and NBC in the San Antonio market. YouTube TV also carries locals plus unlimited DVR storage. Sling TV is a more affordable option, but its local channel availability can be limited—often only Fox and NBC in San Antonio. FuboTV is a great choice for sports fans, with extensive coverage of NFL, NBA, MLB, and soccer.

If you prefer on-demand streaming without live TV, services like Netflix, Amazon Prime Video, Disney+, and Hulu (on-demand) offer thousands of shows and movies. However, they do not include live local news or sports. For a comprehensive viewing experience, many people combine a live TV

streaming service with an on-demand subscription.

How to Find the Most Accurate TV Guide in San Antonio

Traditional printed TV guides are rare now. Digital guides are the norm. Here are the best ways to stay updated on what's airing in San Antonio:

1. **TV Guide website or mobile**

app: The classic source still exists. You can input your zip code

(78205 for downtown San Antonio) and your provider to see a customized schedule.

2. **Zap2it:** A popular online TV listings site that also allows you to filter by genre, time, and channel.
3. **Local station websites:** KSAT.com, KENS5.com, WOAI.com, and KABB.com all have their own TV listings for the day.
4. **Your cable/satellite/streaming guide:** Most providers have an interactive guide accessible via your remote or app. They are usually more up-to-date than third-party sites.
5. **Voice assistants:** Ask Siri, Google Assistant, or Alexa "What's on TV tonight?" and they can pull up local listings.

Keep in mind that schedules can change due to breaking news, sports overruns, or special events. Always double-check your preferred **Tv Guide San Antonio Texas** source on the day of viewing.

Local News and Sports Programming

San Antonio is crazy about its sports teams. The San Antonio Spurs (NBA) are a major draw. Games air on Bally Sports Southwest (formerly Fox Sports Southwest) and occasionally on national networks like TNT, ABC, or ESPN. If you are a Spurs fan, make sure your TV

package includes Bally Sports Southwest—it is available on Spectrum, DIRECTV, and some streaming services like FuboTV (check current agreements).

For football, the Dallas Cowboys are the most popular team in the region, but the Houston Texans and San Antonio-based college teams (UTSA Roadrunners) also get coverage. NFL games air on CBS, Fox, NBC, and ESPN/ABC. College football on ESPN and local stations is also popular.

Local newscasts are a critical part of the viewing experience. The major stations all have morning, noon, evening, and late-night newscasts. KSAT 12, KENS 5, WOAI 4, and KABB 29 all invest heavily in weather coverage, especially during hurricane season or severe thunderstorms. Many also have

dedicated weather apps and 24/7 weather subchannels.

Subchannels and Over-the-Air Viewing

If you use an antenna in San Antonio, you can pick up many more channels than just the main broadcasts. Digital subchannels offer vintage TV shows, movies, and niche content. For example, MeTV (available on KSAT 12.3) broadcasts classic shows like M*A*S*H, The Andy Griffith Show, and I Love Lucy. Comet (29.2) is a sci-fi channel. Charge! (29.3) offers action movies and series.

Laff (5.3) is a comedy channel. These are free and easy to add to your TV guide.

To get the best reception, place your antenna near a window or on your roof. San Antonio's terrain is mostly flat, so signals travel well, but buildings and trees can cause interference. A good amplified indoor antenna can pull in stations from up to 50 miles away. Check the FCC's website for a map of broadcast towers in your area.
